

To promote policy coherence and raise the profile of the OECD Guidelines and the NCP, the Ireland NCP held a stakeholder outreach event directed at Government Departments and agencies. This provided a briefing on the OECD Guidelines, the role of the NCP, the specific instance process, the OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Business Conduct and the OECD's sector-specific due diligence guidance.

G. Challenges

61. Has the NCP faced any particular **challenge(s)** it would like to highlight this year?

2021 saw the Ireland NCP's resources increase significantly. The NCP was also transferred from the trade policy unit of the Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment to a standalone unit within the Department's trade division. Challenges arose in the integration and training of new staff and the transfer to a new unit. These increased resources led to a revision of an ongoing specific instance, including a revised initial assessment. The NCP's workload grew significantly with the receipt of five new specific instances in 2021. The office also embarked on the process of mediation for the first time, engaging in the procurement of a professional mediator. Challenges arose in co-ordinating with the parties to a specific instance complaint on the arrangement of mediation sessions. The NCP was also required to prepare for peer review, including on-site visits on 27 and 28 October. The NCP notes that having adapted to these challenges with some success, it hopes to progress strongly in 2022, with new staffing and resources integrated into its working process.
