Several specific instances raised complex jurisdictional questions which required the NCP to carry out extensive consultations with other NCPs. 57. The NCP was further advised that the company's functions and contractual relationships would be absorbed by its new owner and it had therefore ceased operations.

In light of the fact that the company had ceased trading and was no longer engaged in the activities that had formed the basis of the complaint, the Ireland NCP concluded that an offer of good offices would not be practicable or contribute to the resolution of the issues. The NCP therefore closed the specific instance.
